# Sessions

- ES arguments and governance
  - Plural understandings of the language of ES: wide to narrow, positive to negative
  - Different modes of governance co-exist, but the emphasis varies
- Use of ES arguments in practice
  - Context dependence:
    - Different approaches in protected areas and the wider landscape
    - Relevance depends on aim of decision making situation
    - Varies with connectedness to human systems
    - Possible value of collaborative interactions in enhancing ES arguments
